BEHAVIOURS	- Looking at the home page, first impressions - User notices lack of colour contrast - User notices ads first - User is looking for bar at the top of the page "which tells me kind of where I'm from, where I'm going and its a return trip" - User immediately goes to location & language bar at top of page - User does not know from where to start says it "could befrom Discover?"	- "I'm going to scroll down, and that is what I was looking for. So I'm looking for something that gives me where I'm from and where I'm going"  - Filling in all the fields, mainly using mouse to click  - User uses the calendar to choose dates  - User chooses option to have one-way flights shown only	- "I'm expecting to see the options that I have as far as flights on certain days, the options of time, as well as the options of flight price"  - Looking at options of flight dates, time, price on the page  - "I think there would be an option to add a bag later on"  - User is happy to see the date they chose has a cheaper fare  - User seems very confused, and thinking hard as she cannot figure out how to select the flights and continue  - In absence of X to close window, user goes with secondary mental model which is to click outside the window  - User reads through luggage fare options to make a selection	- User fills in the fields by clicking into each field to start typing	- User does not want to pay for a seat, searching for option to have a randomly allocated seat - User scrolls down to explore types of seats - User decides to continue without a seat selection	-User sees first thing on page is Baggage -> "I was expecting this, I'm expecting to be able to add a check-in bag and as well as sports equipment"  - User easily adds the exact type of sports equipment they need (scuba gear) from the drop-down menu  - User scrolls down to see what other extras there are, notices options are ticked and unchecks the boxes although "I don't think I need to do that but I'm gonna go down [the page]"

PAIN POINTS	- No contrast - details get lost "There's not really anything that pops out""that oh I need to go there""need to take my time and read"  - User does not immediately go to "Plan and Book" from the menu bar  - Does not immediately go to "Book" from the menu bar and instead tries "Discover" which is right next to it  - Cookie pop up -> "I get sick of these Accept All for every website I go into so I Just ignore it"	- Have to scroll down to see the bar where user can fill in the details to search for a flight - Does not notice the "Search Flights" button to lead her to the next page.  - User notes that button is not eye-catching enough and blends into background.  - "Gave the option for car hire and everything straight away so, I didn't really want that and like that"  - Misses auto-fill option for destination location, types it in instead  - User expects different markings in the spaces for dates -> "it didn't suggest that you put your dates in there, there was no little markings on it to say, that would prompt it to say you need to put your date in"  - Did not notice calendar at first  - When choosing dates, calendar not immediately visible/available	- User does not immediately know how to continue to next stage  - User did not get baggage fares when they selected their outbound flight as they were expecting  - Pop-up suggesting to the user to upgrade, contradicting user's choice of the value fare which upset the user  - Only one option of flight time and duration given. No information if there are others  - User does not understand two of the three benefits listed in the "Saver" option.  - User misses that the prices listed in the luggage options are buttons.  - Does not notice added feature of "Price Lock Flights" at first.  - Confused by prices, not clear if they are for one or two people/separate for departure and return flights -> "it doesn't tell you that its for two people because I'm presuming that this is for one person"  - Pricing slows down the process of getting to her goal  - Does not realise her return flight is at a different airport. Assumes it will be the same automatically.  - User's eyes go to the middle of the page, confuses arrival time with departure time  - Departure time should be more clear -> "I. would prefer to have the departure time  - Departure time should be more clear -> "I. would prefer to have the departure time  - Departure time should be more clear -> "Just don't know how to close itthere's no X"  - Bizclass felt unnecessary information if not available, and upset the user  - Details of luggage packages a bit confusing, took a lot of reasoning out to understand  - "Collect more miles" feature seems pointless, based on past experiences of no reward despite being a frequent filer.  - Save your price feature not clear, confusing "they could word it a bit better"	- Unnecessary fields - Miles+ Bonus, Loyalty card number, Business on board number	- User does not notice button "Proceed without seat selection" immediately	- User needs to uncheck the options for the extras they don't need - No options for different types of sports equipment, this confuses the user - Although there is a note that states instruments larger than cabin bags they need to be checked in the user still feels a bit unsure as she notes she never had to take instruments before - "It does not seem they are going to give me the options" - Pop up for insurance, which user does not need - Navigation out of the "more services" page not clear enough - "More Services" page felt unnecessary
